Where We Serve

ARM serves mostly Macon County and some in Lee County. The towns we serve include, but are not limited to, Tuskegee, Notasulga, Hurtsboro, Beaufort, and Loachapoka.

Accommodations

Tuskegee, AL – Located in the central eastern part of Alabama, Tuskegee is a town rich in history and culture. Groups that come to Tuskegee stay in an old antebellum home located in the heart of the town. It has three bedrooms, two bathrooms, a full kitchen, dining room, and common rooms. The house accommodates approximately 25 comfortably with overflow (of up to 25 people) accommodated at Tuskegee First United Methodist Church a block from the house. While in the area we recommend you visit the Tuskegee Airmen Museum and the George Washington Carver Museum. Tuskegee is 30 miles from Montgomery and 20 miles from Auburn.

Insurance Policy

All team members must have their own medical/health insurance *or* be covered under your church insurance. All volunteers will be required to complete a medical release form as well as a release of liability form (to be received later). Volunteers under the age of 19 must have a legal guardian signature on their release of liability form.

Home Repair

Projects include, but are not limited to: roofing, dry wall repair, minor plumbing, carpentry (floors, porches, ramps) and depend on the skills of your volunteers. You will be contacted approximately a week prior to arrival about your project(s) and information about the family with whom you will serve.

Work Crews

Each group will be divided into work crews of 4-7 people. You will be breaking up into work crews of 4-7 people. Youth groups must have a minimum of one (preferably two) adults per work crew. **You will also need one construction knowledgeable person per crew.**

We recommend you bring basic tools such as hammers, gloves, and cordless drills. Bringing as many tools as possible is encouraged. **You will need one vehicle for each work crew for transportation to and from the work sites and for safety reasons.**

Cost

Group Registration Fee: \$50 – a one time fee to secure your group's dates

Per Person Costs:

- Fall, Winter, or Spring Break Week-long (Sun – Fri): \$215
- Weekend Trips: \$80

These costs provide for your lodging and home repair materials. Meals are NOT included. A full kitchen is available for your group to use for meal preparation.
